Located in Bloomfield, NJ, with about 1700 students, Bloomfield College offers the lowest tuition of any private institution in the state, comprehensive and course fees have been eliminated and those applying for admission have the option of not submitting standardized test scores (SAT/ACT), except in select circumstances.

Application

Interested applicants can apply online through the Common Application or via the Bloomfield College website at www.bloomfield.edu/apply. Students can also choose to complete the paper application during the time of the appointment. Fee waiver codes cannot be provided for the Common Application. The \$40 application fee will be waived for all students participating who complete the online or paper application.

Instant Decision Day Requirements

Application

Students must apply and list a Camden choice on their application. If a student does not apply to Camden, we cannot provide a decision; each campus reviews their own applications. It can take up to 72 hours for an application to show in the system, so we ask that the student apply at least a week prior to the date of the IDD. In addition, students must the \$70.00 application fee (or have a waiver ready to give our Admissions representative that day) at least 72 hours prior to the date of the IDD.
